Niles Canyon Road Closed to Motor Vehicles on September 22 Full Access to Hikers, Bicyclists and Runners

For the third time in four years, Alameda County along with numerous other public agencies are hosting the Niles Canyon Stroll and Roll, to give pedestrians full access to the scenic roadway and to raise public awareness about a proposed public trail through the scenic canyon.

WHO: Hosts include Alameda County Supervisors Scott Haggerty and Richard Valle, East Bay Regional Park District, City of Fremont and others examining a proposed public trail through historic Niles Canyon

WHAT: Niles Canyon Stroll and Roll

A 6.4-mile stretch of Niles Canyon Road will be closed between Old Canyon Road in Fremont and Main Street in Sunol from 5:00am - 4:00pm September 22. **From 7am to 8am cyclists will have exclusive access to the road and from 8am to 2pm hikers, runners and bicyclists will have full access to the road without automobile traffic.** Staff from Alameda County and the East Bay Regional Park District will also be on hand with visual displays and other information to help the public understand the proposal to build a Class 1 trail through the canyon.

SHUTTLE: Participants are encouraged to use public transportation. Free shuttle service provided to and from the Fremont BART station shuttle bay A-5 during event hours.
